January Meeting Minutes

Jan. 17, 2008

The January meeting was called to order by President Ronnie Nicholson. Invocation was given by Dickey Albright.

Ron stated that the club's treasurer, David Nussbaumer, was absent so there was no treasurer report but that the balance had not changed. Motion to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter was made by Ronnie Nicholson; 2nd by Ed Rawlins. Motion passed on vote.

Discussion began with Old Business concerning The Cattlemen's Association who are working to build a \$2,000,000 building on Rossview Road. We hope we can be a part of that by raising money with the sale of the tractor. We can put the money into an outbuilding for use of the Cattlemen's club and 4-H. Ronnie said that when he last talked to John Barteo he said that they would auction the steers and then would stop the auction to sell the tractor before selling the grand champion. This would keep people from leaving the arena. Ronnie said that the club needs to get a brochure made up with a picture of the tractor on it to advertise the sale. The auction date is on May 13, 2008.

Ron Toutges made motion to put the club tractor in the May 13 Cattlemen's club and 4-H cattle auction; 2nd was by Ed Rawlings. The motion passed.

Ronnie asked for a motion to do the tractor ride for St. Jude on May 17, 2008. He asked that they all participate and get sponsors. He said they would leave his place at 1:00 PM and it would also be their annual picnic. Motion was made by Raymond; seconded by Randy. It was noted that the club would buy the food and desserts would be provided by the members and that would be included in the motion. Motion carried.

When asked about the tractor ride flyers Randy responded that he and Rawhide had taken some to Western and that Roy Sampson, who has been to our show, said he would pass them out at their club's meeting and that he hoped to see him in May. Randy noted that their club is located between Franklin and Bowling Green which is not that far away.

When asked about the show flyers, Raymond said that they haven't done anything on them yet because he has been waiting for more information on having steam there. He said that he has talked with Bruce Jobe and that steam would not be problem insurance wise. He said David Nussbaumer has spoken to Jackie Swann about having his steam engines at the show and he seemed to be excited about our bringing them there. Raymond said he is still waiting to hear from the Kiwanis about transporting the engine. Ronnie said that Ricky or Gene would be the ones to move the steam engine. Raymond also said that he had talked to Robin Blue, who has a threshing machine that he would let us use if we can get it moved to Clarksville. Ronnie said that they are limited on space.

Discussion followed concerning having the right kind of straw or grain for the thresher. Eddie Wheeler said he will plant some grains that can be used in the show.

Ronnie said the club is looking for insurance for one day for the tractor ride. Dave Nussbaumer is getting prices. Ronnie said that the board had passed it but they need to put it before the membership to vote on the one day ride insurance. Humphries County had obtained the insurance for \$393.00 but until they could get some accurate dollar amounts they should hold off on a motion.

Rawhide brought up the Cumberland City ride and that this year it would be on July 4th which is a Friday. The ride starts at 10:00 am so you have to come early to line up.

Ending old business, Ronnie reminded members that club dues are due.

With New Business Dickey introduced the idea of having the 4-H participate in the Tractor Show and how they could set up, whether it is in a tent or one of the pavilions. He said that he had talked to Rusty Evans, who is no longer with the 4-H, but that the new officials may be interested. After discussion, motion was made by Rawhide to have Gary and Dickey approach the 4-H to join the tractor show; seconded by Randy. Motion passed.

February Board Meeting Minutes

February 4, 2008

The February board meeting was called to order by President Ronnie Nicholson. Board members attending were Ron Toutges, Ronnie Nicholson, Wayne Wunningham, Raymond Bagwell, Edward Rawlings, Randy Bogard, Eddie Wheeler, Gary Burton and David Nussbaumer. Guests were Elaine Nicholson, Corrine Bogard, Mrs. Burton and family and Amy Wheeler and family. Invocation was given by Randy Bogard.

Minutes from the previous meeting as printed in the newsletter had been approved at the January regular meeting. David Nussbaumer, Treasurer, reported that after paying Jana Patterson \$24.54 for cards and stamps the account balance was \$2,389.63. Ronnie asked David if either he or Raymond had given Bobby Dean Bagby any money for the port-a-pot. David responded that they were going to wait until the next meeting. Ronnie asked for David to note it somewhere that the club is to pay Bobby Dean Bagby \$93.00 for the port-a-pot used on Plow Day. Motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Randy; seconded by Raymond. Motion passed.

Continuing with old business, Ronnie stated that he was going to Wayne's garage and wrap the walls so they could set the tractor back in there to be painted. Ronnie said that if the members had not seen it there had been an article in the Leaf-Chronicle about the tractor and that he heard that there had also been an article in the Tennessean.

David said that he had checked with Carter Briggs for information about insurance for club events. David said that he could provide a million dollar year-round general liability policy but would need to know the number of events and approximate number of people participating. He said for the year policy it would be about \$625.25 and that for one event you would be talking about \$225.00. After some discussion Ronnie asked for a motion to present the insurance information to the members at the regular meeting. David said that they needed to get the list of events first so that they could get a more concrete premium amount. Raymond made the motion that David get a firm price on all events to include Rural King and Tractor Supply mini-shows and the board recommend that the club buy liability insurance which is estimated to be around the \$625.00. Second was by Randy Bogard. Motion passed. It was asked if another event came up which had not been on the list such as a Veterans Day event would the insurance cover it. David responded that you would just notify the insurance agent.

Ronnie reminded everyone of the May 17th tractor ride and that he and Randy had some brochures and that they all should try to be looking for sponsors.

Raymond said that he heard from Bruce Jobe and he had said that they didn't think transporting the steam engine would be a problem. He said that the 4-H may want something in the flyer so he hasn't got it together yet.

There was discussion as to some other ways of raising funds for the insurance such as charging a small amount for the Cumberland City ride.

New business: Ronnie reminded everyone of the St. Bethlehem Pioneer Days event to be held April 25th at St. Bethlehem Elementary School from 9:00 till about noon. Ronnie said that he would bring a couple of sacks of corn and Carl usually brings some too.

Feb. 17 – regular meeting – 4:00p.m. Raymond and Randy have refreshments.

Motion for adjournment was made and seconded. The meeting then adjourned.
